Explanation of Methodology for 2012 Delegate Numbers

State Assembly:

The delegations to the State Convention and Assembly were based upon each county's vote for Governor in the 2010 General Election. The Party divided a base of 3000 delegates among the counties according to each county's share of the statewide total. For counties that did not receive at least 4 delegates under this calculation, their delegate total was increased to the county minimum of 4 delegates.

In addition to the number of delegates allocated to each county, the county *may* elect a number of alternates equal to the number of delegates allocated.

Multi-County Districts:

The delegations for the Congressional Districts and other multi-county districts are the same as for the State Convention and Assembly if the county is wholly within the district. (Note that an apportionment is not necessary for single-county districts, as these assemblies are comprised of all of the delegates to the county assembly within those districts.) These delegate numbers were determined using the **new Congressional Districts and new State House and State Senate Districts** created during the redistricting and reapportionment processes finalized in December of 2011.

If the formula resulted in less than 2 delegates for that portion of the county, the allocation was adjusted upward to the split-county minimum of two delegates. The State Party used precinct level data from the 2010 election acquired from the Secretary of State's office. Please be advised that these allocations of delegates are the defaults for all multi-county districts. Pursuant to State Party Rules, a **district** central committee *may* use a different formula, or different methodology, for allocating and electing delegates to the district assembly (a **county** central committee does **not** have the authority or power to adopt rules affecting a multi-county district). **This should be done prior to the precinct caucuses in March.** However, if this is not done, the delegate allocations used herein will be used, and the vast majority of multi-county districts have historically opted to utilize the numbers provided by the state herein as their numbers.

The numbers herein only reflect multi-county new districts holding elections in 2012. Keep in mind that all numbers reflect the changes made to Congressional and State Legislative Districts due to the reapportionment and redistricting processes. Single-county districts (i.e., districts wholly within one county) hold their district assemblies in conjunction with the county assembly, and those delegate allocations are not affected by the numbers herein.
